Let us pray for Japan and pray that more people can hear the gospel, experience the love of Christ, accept the Lord's salvation, and have the hope and joy of eternal life.



Time flies, the United States is about to enter the Thanksgiving season, and this year is about to end. We would like to wish everyone a "Happy Thanksgiving." Although this year is really tough for most people, let us pause and count God's blessing. In the midst of challenges, we can still witness God's care and blessing in each one of us.

This time we have been back in the United States for more than 6 months, and we did not expect to stay that long, but God's time is really the best. During this period, we had the opportunity to visit churches, and through the Inter-

net, we also connected with many fellowships, groups, and churches. To make a rough calculation, I have shared almost 30 times in the Zoom/google meeting. I also preached on Sundays in 3 different churches. Thank the Lord for the arrangement and opportunity. Now the waiting is over. Thank God we have completed the first step to apply for the reentry permit (fingerprints, background check). We can leave the US and wait in Japan for the final reentry permit docu-

ments. Please pray for us that we can get the reentry permit soon. (So we can return to the US next time). We have bought the ticket to fly back to Japan on 11/16. We still need to do a COVID test tomorrow (11/14). If none of us has the virus, we are free to go. Thanks to many brothers, sisters, and churches for their support and help in the past 6 months. We pray that the Lord would take care of each one of you. We also ask the Lord to have mercy on the United States. We hope that the vaccine will be available as soon as possible and end this global pandemic. I also pray that the Lord will strengthen the churches, recharge at this waiting time, and prepare to run a new race for the kingdom of heaven.

- After 6 months of waiting, we are finally ready to go back to Japan. Our ticket is on 11/16. Please pray for a safe journey back to Japan.

Although he is much better, the attitude of reluctance to learn Japanese has always been there. In the past six months, God has gradually changed him. Now he is willing to learn Japanese and very much to look forward to returning to Japan. God really did answer all of your (and our) prayers. Let us praise the Lord together.
- Abby's personality is always timid. When we first moved into the missionary apartment, she was unwilling to play with other children. In the past one or two months, God gradually changes her. She made friends with several MKs. Now that we are about to leave, she feels sad. Please pray for her adjustment.
- Because we have been back in the US for 6 months, Abby's Japanese has almost forgotten. Going back to Japan, we will face new adjustments. Plus, next year, in April, Abby will be entering elementary school. There will be a big change. Please pray for her, ask the Lord to help her adapt quickly, and pray that the Lord will provide good classmates and teachers for her. Also, pray for her willingness to learn the Japanese language.
- Although we have finished processing the fingerprints, we still have to wait for a while before receiving the reentry permit. (we can wait in Japan) After the approval, we will get it at the US Embassy in Japan. Please pray for this process will go smoothly.
- Please continue to pray for me and Jennifer's Japanese learning. Due to the pandemic, Japanese language school and community classes were suspended at the beginning of the year. Then, we return to the United States; our language learning was greatly interrupted. Although we continue to learn on the Internet, we must use it in real life to make more progress. Please pray for us so we can continue to improve.
